

HURRICANE TRACKING CHART

How to Plot Storms and Hurricanes

After a storm has been located, the National Weather Center issues advisories that state the location of the storm in terms of degrees and tenths of degrees latitude (°North) and longitude (°West). These are the coordinates. Find latitude by reading from the bottom upward and longitude by reading from right to left. Place a dot where the coordinates intersect and mark the date and time. You'll then be able to follow the path of the storm.
